AUTOGRAPH LETTER SIGNED, "SINCERELY, RONALD"

Ronald Reagan: ALS. *Condolence Letter to W. H. Shipman on the Death of Mother.* Written in ink without date but with the envelope stamped in upper left corner Warner Bros. Studio, Burbank, Calif. and postmarked Los Angeles and dated March 23, 1848. The letter is addressed, "Dear Friend" and the envelope is addressed to Mr. W. H. Shipman and sent via General Delivery c/o Mrs. Fred Sapp of Stark, Florida. A counter stamp on the verso of the envelope shows that the letter arrived in Stark, Florida on the 27th of March. \$7,500.00


Written on $4\frac{3}{4} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ inch blank paper, folded in thirds. Approximately 200 words. The condition of the letter is very good, but the envelope is soiled, and the stamp on the envelope has been torn away.

The letter begins, "Dear Friend, I can't tell you how sorry I was to learn that your mother passed away, that is someone so close that I often wonder why they are taken away, because no matter how old we get . . . we still seem to need our mothers.:

Hoping that 1948 is a better year for both his friend and himself, he writes about his separation from his wife Jane Wyman. "I am sure that for Jane and myself things will straighten out, and we will be back together. I feel sure. . . ". Mentioning that his Friend is "still interested in the club" (the Ronald Reagan International Fan Club), he suggest that he write to Zelda Multz president of the fan club from 1937-1967, and request the latest issue of the "Journal". He concludes the letter with the phase, "God bless you always, Sincerely, Ronald."

Although I was unable to identify W. A. Shipman, Mrs. Fred Sapp was a friend of Reagan's, and wife of the publisher of the *Illinois Daily Republican* Fred A. Sapp. Mrs. Sapp was a Regent of the Daughters of

the American Revolution, and member of the Daughters of Colonial Wars and the Daughters of Patriots and Founders of America.






